5. Presenter and Session Leader Guide

Prior to the Meeting:

Session Leader: On the Monday or Tuesday prior to the next meeting – email each presenter and confirm: attendance, sending of the HTTP links for the sites to Session Leader. Ask each presenter for a short two sentence introduction. Highlight the expectation of 10 minute maximums.

Presenters: respond to Session Leader with links to the 3 sites you will discuss and the one or two sentence introduction for you. Call/email the Session Leader if you cannot make the meeting so an alternate can be located. The time slots are very important – we only have 20 meetings per year.

At the Meeting:

Session Leader to confirm with presenters on content and order of presenting. Review the process and answer any questions. Make sure you have a timing mechanism and the IT Coordinator in place with the websites ready to go. Introduce each presenter. The IT Coordinator will bring up the website. The Presenter will talk about the site and respond to questions from the group. The Session Leader will alert the presenter when time is up and close the discussion. The Session Leader will also keep short notes to add to the collection (this Website Discussion Guide) for reference.

At the end of the session:

The Session Leader will close the discussion, summarize the session and thank the presenters. Ask for volunteers to present at the next meeting along with several alternates. This will be added to the schedule and agenda for the next meeting. Update the Website Discussion Guide with the links and summary of each, update the schedule of presenters and add the presenters finished to the list of previous presenters with timings. Send the updated document to the IT Coordinator for posting to the Agenda and to the website. All of this should take no longer than an hour per meeting.
